Dear friends in Christ at Peace and Grue,

Luther never questioned that baptism is one of the central practices for the Christian faith. As much as Luther the reformer broke with tradition, he actually preferred to stay with tradition, especially with those traditions God had blessed. He saw no reason to implement change for the sake of change, instead he argued that a proper education was what was needed. Something that is beyond the scope of a simple newsletter article. My hope is to raise a couple of points, that give an assurance of a certainty and truth.

Since most of us were baptized as infants, I'll focus on that. Baptismal faith is faith that the Creator of heaven and earth acts in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit to reclaim his lost creatures here and now through the water and the Word. Since this is an external thing and not my doing, faith has something to believe in. Baptismal faith is simply to believe that this external event is not an accident, it is God's intervention for you. The proper sequence is that the promise comes first, and the faith that receives it comes second.

The standard worry about this sequence is that it will lead to "cheap grace." "You do not mean to say that a mere external ceremony can save you, do you?" The way we answer that question will betray us. Usually, one is tempted to set up all kinds of conditions: "No of course it will not work unless you have enough faith, or the right faith, or are properly converted, or feel it in your heart, or show it in your life" and so on. The implication is that one has to go somewhere and get faith so that baptism can "work" putting the self-back into the driver's seat. While such a faith may be ever so pious, Luther's question remains: "Does it have anything to believe but itself?"

The tragic irony is that the temptation to call on human decision (believer's baptism) to protect baptism undercuts baptism. The very offense of externality itself is the only defense against cheap grace. It is the announcement that God refuses to pander to us. Grace is not cheap it is free. That is the problem. The free gift destroys the self who wishes to stay in control. If grace were not free the old self would still be in business. Baptism signals the end of old being incurably turned inward upon itself, who even uses its own religiosity as the last line of defense. The self has to be turn inside out.

Since the self can never give up, baptism is a daily event. Whoever is baptized, infant or adult, must be nurtured in this grace putting to death the old self until a new self who believes in the externality of God "out there" at last arises. To be sure, the baptism of infants is no guarantee that proper baptismal faith will be forthcoming. But with infant baptism at least the sequence is maintained and so the possibility of baptismal faith is permanently opened. Since baptism is a permanent offense to the old self, what is needed is proper nurture. The only cure for the abuses surrounding baptism is to teach and preach it properly, not to withhold it or postpone it.

Grace is not a hidden agenda. We do not need to protect the Lord from the Lord's own generosity. To be sure, there is wholesale confusion and misunderstand about the sacraments, just as there is about Christian theology in general. The only real weapon left to the church is the gracious and saving acts of God who works faith through the external Word and sacraments. And that, certainly, is as it should be.


