Dear friends in Christ at Peace and Grue,

"For the kingdom of God depends not on talk but on power" (1 Corinthians 4:20).

If the gospel were not Jesus Christ himself, Paul could not describe it as the power of God. As the power of God, the Word of the gospel is none other than the kingdom of God. It does not simple proclaim it or point to it; it brings it causing the hears, you and me, to enter it. As Jesus Christ, as the power of God, the gospel does more than simply offer the possibility that I can actualize and make it my own by my own decision, effort or power. The Word itself is the power of God, God's kingdom.

If the Word is so significant, great importance attaches to its exact form. It has the form of a promise like the promise in Isaiah 43:1: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine." The promise we find in Luke 2:10-11, "Do not be afraid...to you is born this day...a Savior." The whole Bible, Old Testament and New, abounds in such promises.

Most important for Luther is the presence of Jesus Christ himself, the power of God, in the promises of confession and forgiveness, baptism, and the Lord's Supper. "By his authority I forgive you all your sins." "I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." The meaning is this: "You belong to me, you are in my hands, says God; therefore "Take and eat, this is my body given for you! Take and drink, this cup is the new testament in my blood that was shed for the forgiveness of your sins!" By such a promise God discloses himself as the one who is in communion with us.

These promises are the center of Luther's theology. When he says that God promises, he is not referring to something in the future that we may anticipate. As a good medieval German, he was thinking along the lines of the way a ruler bound and committed himself at his enthronement, a valid and powerful promise or pledge that takes place immediately and has a present effect. The ruler in making this commitment is bound by it and will keep it.

Faith lays hold of God by accepting and counting on the given promises, and therefore it lays hold of the faith-fulness of God, of his truth, his word, his righteousness. The truth of faith lies in participation in the promise and faithfulness of God that is promised and imparted to it. This is how God commits himself in the promises made in his name.

The Psalms often speak of the "faith" of God. In his "faith" God gives faith to us, pledging himself to us in order that we can relying on him, as we ourselves stand by what we say and live up to what is expected. Throughout Scripture, God glorifies himself regarding us in the fact that he is merciful and faithful, always displaying faithfulness and blessing. We can rely upon it that he will do this, faithfully fulfilling all that we expect.

As we enter into 2024, we look back on the way the church found its strength in the promises of God. And we look ahead to the opportunities that are promised and imparted to it through faith in Jesus Christ, the power of God, the gospel itself.




