Pastoral from the Pastor

Dear friends in Christ at Peace and Grue,

In every season of life, God calls us to serve others.

Whether graduating from school or into a new season of life, it is important to end well. Ending well allows us to honor what was and to enter fully into all that is to come. Many life transitions are uneventful. For instance, we tend not to think much about the passing of each day. However, some transitions require more intentionality to end well. A graduation ceremony, for instance, distinctly marks the end of one's academic career. It's a finale that leaves no question of status –the student is now an alumnus. Without such a clear ending, a student might be stuck in limbo – neither letting go of the past nor fully living in the present.

Most of us love new beginnings. Very few of us enjoy endings. And therein lies our dilemma. We can't start something new without ending something old. What's curious is why we choose some beginnings and resist others. Here's what I think: We tend to select the beginnings that don't come with complicated endings. However sometimes it is unavoidable so here are six things to keep in mind, six things your Interim Pastor will help you with:

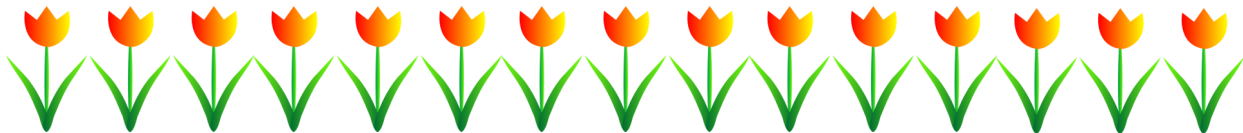
1. Focus on the ending before you launch a beginning. Beginnings are exciting, but when you fixate too much on the new without proper focus on the old, you can't end well. When you don't end well, you struggle to start strong. Ending well is the best way to begin something new.
2. Acknowledge what is lost. Every ending brings loss. In most cases, endings bring multiple losses. Every loss matters to someone.
3. Before you begin something new, you need to grieve, Grieve a loss now or it will create grief for you later. And that takes some intentional time.
4. During the ending experience, it's easy to feel overwhelmed. Intentionally work at clarifying the mission and vision that drive the new beginning you're hoping to create so the emotions of ending don't unnecessarily derail your new beginning.
5. Accept that life will be uncomfortable for a while. To move forward with any beginning, you must get out of the La-Z-boy recliner and live in the discomfort for a while, trusting that a new comfort will be found after the conclusion is complete and the new beginning is afoot.
6. Celebrate what was before beginning what's to come. In all the excitement of a beginning, reflection and introspection aren't always natural, but it helps to process where you've been, how to end, and what's to begin.


Whatever you are leaving behind has shaped you into who you are today. As such, your past should hold an honored place in your story. This does not mean you hold on to it any longer than necessary or have any desire to repeat it. Ending well allows you to bless what has been and live with an eager expectation of all the good God still has in store for you. Knowing you are still on the way toward the good God has for you allows you to freely let go of what is passing and be fully open to all that is yet to come.

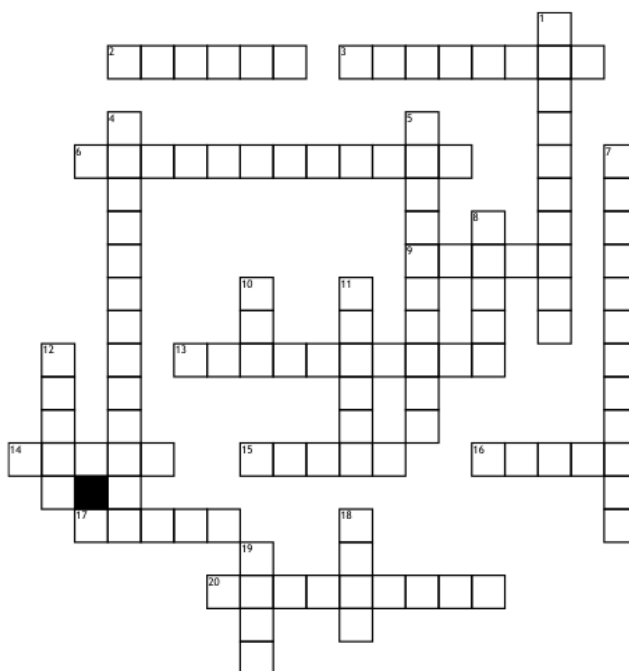
