Dear friends in Christ at Peace and Grue,

In the Northern Hemisphere it's summer: a time of vacation, rest, and renewal, but not necessarily for all of us. The word is out. Americans take less time off and enjoy fewer days of vacation than any other industrialized nation in the West.

Walter Brueggemann, in his book "Journey to the Common Good," speaks about this. He writes, "Sabbath, in the first instance, is not about worship. It is about work stoppage. It is about withdrawal from the anxiety system of Pharaoh, the refusal to let one's life be defined by production and consumption and the endless pursuit of private well-being. It is easy to imagine that in Pharaoh's system there never was a sabbath for anyone. Everyone was 24/7. The slaves never got a day off and perhaps had to multitask to meet their quotas. Pharaoh surely never took a day off; he was too busy writing memos and sending out work orders and quotas. As a result everyone was caught up in an endless process of production and accumulation." (p.26)

We don't mean to, I'm sure, but our busyness, our ceaseless activity gives the impression that we believe that it is up to us to do good or good won't be done. It's up to us to set the world right or the world is lost. Behind our busyness is the blasphemous belief that we are the saviors and the solution to what ails the world.

To stand and say in the Creed, "I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth," is to say that we believe that it is not up to us to make the world right. God not only created but is still creating and creative. God is not dead, inactive, or ineffective. Thus we can rest and relish times of inactivity, reflection, and the good grace of doing nothing.

Sunday worship gives us a taste of this. Here, while we do much activity-praying, singing, listening, meditating-little of it is useful, productive, or essential, as the world defines these matters. We are relaxing, resting, remembering-hoping, singing, and telling stories-as we simply enjoy being with one another and with God. Christians believe that this is a foretaste of eternity when we rest from our labors and enjoy being in the presence of God forever. Our destiny, in God's hands, is rest. That rest is a great tribute to God, a confession that our destiny is in what God is doing, not in what we do.

The world is not in our hands; the future is not ours to determine. We do God's work as it is entrusted to us. We work and pray and do our best to be light and salt to the world. And then we take sabbath, resting secure in the faith that the most important work is God's. So, if you have not yet taken a vacation, gotten away from it all, experienced a change of scenery, or wandered into the wilderness, I hope you will do so soon. The church stresses other commands of Jesus: to love the poor, to feed the hungry, to bind up another's wound, and to bear one another's burdens. Why not Jesus command to rest?

Education Committee Minutes and Confirmation Update for May 29, 2024

Present at the meeting: Darlane Miller, Sharon Hermanson, Pastor Dan Hermanson, Linda Bahnson, Heidi Balgaard and Carmen Odegaard.

Sunday School update:

Sunday School was led by Heidi Balgaard and Amber Driggins for Peace Lutheran Church. The year was shortened into Fall and Spring sessions from October 1st, 2023, to the December Christmas Program. January was a month off and Sunday school resumed in February 2024 until the end of April. It was felt that the Sunday School attendance was equal for both the Fall and Spring sessions, and this will likely be the outline for the 2024/2025 school year as well. Heidi Balgaard is planning to purchase a CD player and Bluetooth Speaker to allow expansion of the music program for the Sunday School Children; the Sunday School account has money available for these purchases.

Vacation Sunday School dates are set for July 22, 23, 24th with Presbyterian Church in Ashby leading the program. Pastor Dan and Pastor Paul are in communication as to how Peace Lutheran Church can assist the program. More information to follow.

Confirmation update:

We have 3 potential Confirmands for Fall 2024: Becket Johnson, Layne Johnson, and Traeton Nelson. Becket Johnson's requirements are falling short and it is proposed that council sends a letter to Becket and his family of the possibility of not being confirmed this fall. If Becket is unable to fully meet his requirements and if he would like to be confirmed; a full page letter of petition could be submitted to Council before the October Confirmation Banquet as to why he should still be confirmed. Discussion to follow on this topic with Pastor Dan and Council in June 2024.

Layne Johnson has had extenuating circumstances this year and it is purposed that a letter be sent to Layne to invite him to be a part of the October 2024 confirmation. He showed maturity last year by coming to church on his own for confirmation and reaching out to Pastor Dan for numerous visits. Layne was always willing to help with church functions during the 2022/2023 school year. A letter will be sent to both his mother's and father's addresses to make sure that Layne and both parents receive the letter.

Several of the first year confirmands are behind on their sermon notes and activities and a letter of progress will be sent as needed by the confirmation coordinator.

Grue Church will be serving the Confirmation Banquet at Peace Lutheran Church this Fall October 20, 2024. Confirmation will be at Peace on October 27, 2024. To this date there are no Grue Confirmation Students for fall 2024.



On April 4, 1929, the Battle Lake *Review* published an article on its front page titled, “ALTAR PAINTING FOR GRUE “In Gethsemane” Dedicated with Impressive Ceremonies”. This is the same painting and altar we still admire today. The dedication ceremony so appropriately took place on Holy Thursday, the evening of March 28, 1929, beginning at 7:45 p.m. The painting was presented by the Ladies Aid. Rev. and Mrs. Ralph Mortensen, Rev. J. G. Swedberg, the Bethel Choir, Dora and Myrtle Torgerson, Clifford Jorud, and K. K. Evavold participated in the dedication service which included communion and three congregational hymns. Many former members of the church from distant towns were in attendance. Both Norwegian and English languages were used during the service.

Grue's altar painting was created by August Klagstad (1866-1949) and is signed KLAGSTAD -1929 in the lower lefthand corner. August Klagstad was a well-known Norwegian Lutheran artist who at the time was living in Minneapolis. He created his first altar painting in Manistique, Michigan in 1893. He moved to Minneapolis in 1915 where his career was devoted to creating religious paintings. His works are replicas of compositions by the Masters with his own colors and details. He created over 1,000 altar paintings, primarily for churches in Michigan, Wisconsin, and Minnesota.

This painting is a replica of the famous painting, “Christ in Gethsemane” by Heinrich Hofmann (1824-1911) a German painter best known for his paintings depicting the life of Jesus Christ. It appears that Kragstad created this painting in his Minneapolis studio and sent it by train to Ashby. On March 7, 1929, Eagle Lake's news section in the Battle Lake *Review* stated, “The Grue Church has received its altar painting.”


Every Sunday, those who attend Grue are reminded of Jesus' time in the Garden of Gethsemane, the night before his crucifixion, after the Last Supper, and before his betrayal and arrest. After Jesus and the disciples finished the Last Supper and walked toward Gethsemane, Jesus taught them a new commandment - “I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another” (John 13:34).
