A healthy church can be a safety net...it reminds people that their identity is not in their job or how much money they make; they are children of God, loved and protected and infinitely valuable.” Jake Meador*

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace and Grue Parish,  
Blessings to you and as we transition from the season of Epiphany into Lent. The church since the time of Christ, is perpetually in a state of transformation. We are transformed through Christ’s death for the sake of all to offer us grace. Transformation is also how God designs and creates, whether it’s flora, fauna, rocks, roots or human bodies. Transformation is sometimes painful, yet necessary. Personally, I’m glad I moved beyond being zygote, infant, child, teen, young adult, middle aged, into my current state of entering into my “last third of life”. Change and transformation is hardwired into God’s creation, and church is no different. There have always been historic ebbs and flows throughout the life of the church, and today we’re in a downswing. In the past 25 years, 40 million Americans have stopped attending church, creating a sense of fear and anxiety. The church requires constant reflection, self-evaluation and transformation to identify where Christ is calling us into the world. Periodically, we stall out and need a kick start. In her book *The Great Emergence*, author Phyllis Tickle used the analogy of “The 500-Year Rummage Sale” to describe religious change over the years, stating that the church “cleans house” roughly every 500 years, holding what she calls a “giant rummage sale,” deciding what to keep, and what to dispose to allow room for new things. The last rummage sale, the Reformation, happened around 500 years ago, so we’re probably due.

I read an article recently by Jake Meador, attributing the decline in church participation to our cultural shift towards independence, and frankly, the idolatry of self-sufficiency. Meador points out this is problematic not only for the church, but for society in general: “Participation in a religious community generally correlates with better health outcomes and longer life, higher financial generosity, and more stable families—all of which are desperately needed in a nation with rising rates of loneliness, mental illness, and alcohol and drug dependency.”

Sounds consistent with Christ’s teaching and ministry doesn’t it? We are created for community, for mutual support and sharing of our gifts in order to serve the greater good of a hurting world. Perhaps it’s time for we, as church, to set up that rummage sale, shifting our focus from prioritizing our own needs to that of the world we were called to love and serve. The church is needed more than ever. So how do we adapt to live into our call in meaningful, relevant ways? I certainly don’t have the answer, but I have faith that guided by the Spirit through Christ, we can do ministry that matters together. **I am grateful and thankful to be in community with each and every one** of you as we serve as church in a changing world, reaching out to be the positive force of transformation that Christ is calling us to be. 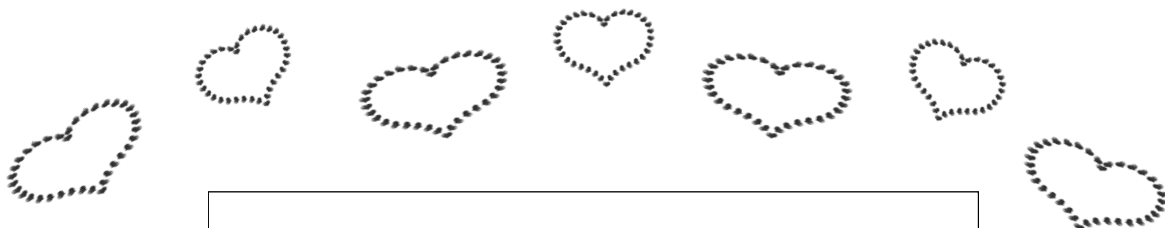

As we move into 2026, we will continue to honor a group from our community or elsewhere to celebrate our country's Semi quincentennial. In February we will celebrate the 3,270 birthdays our past and current President have celebrated.

The first Sunday in February we will have birthday cake to honor Cindy Vorland.

In February to continue to celebrate our country's Semi quincentennial, we will honor our current and past Presidents with birthday cake on the second Sunday. Collectively, and providing the 5 that are alive today are with us at the end of 2026, these 5 men will have celebrated 3,270 birthdays.

A little bit of President trivia: 45 men have served 47 Presidencies: Grover Cleveland served as our 22 and 24 President and Donald Trump has and is serving as our 45 and 47 President. These 45 men have celebrated 43 birth dates. Polk and Harding were both born on November 2 and Andrew Johnson and Woodrow Wilson were born on December 29. One of our past Presidents lived to be 100 and 4 of them were in their 90s when they passed away. No one was born on July 4; however, 3 of them died on that day: John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe. John Tyler is recorded to have the most children, 8 with his first wife and 7 with his second, his youngest child born when he was 70. Five of these men are still living today, with 3 of them born in 1946: Clinton, Bush Jr and Donald Trump.

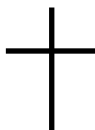

Meeting was adjourned: M/S/C

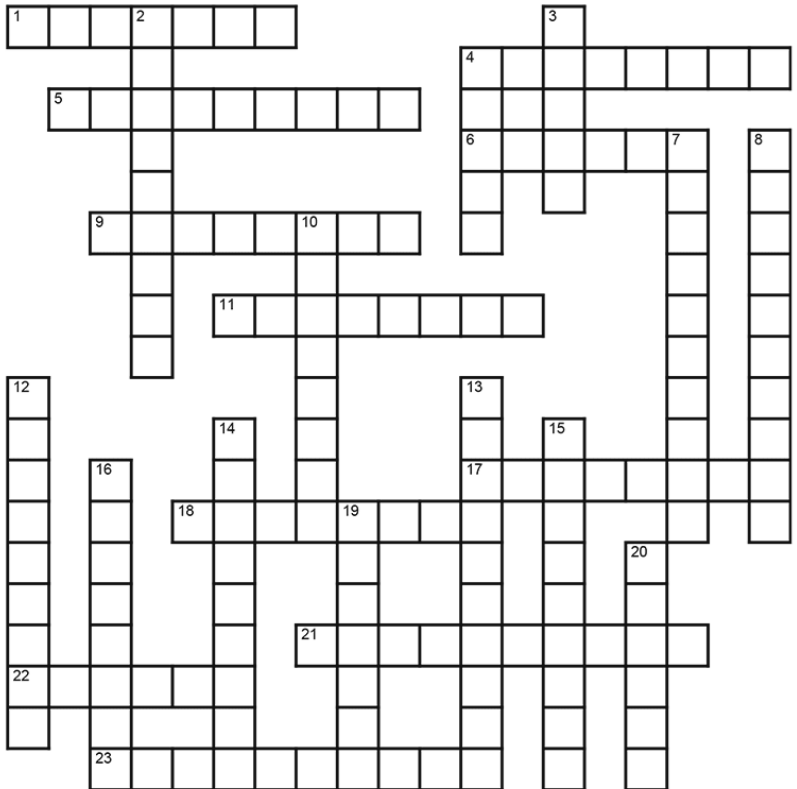
