Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace and Grue Parish,

Blessings to you as we continue our journey together as brothers and sisters in Christ. I hope you’re all enjoying the sunshine and milder weather of our summer months, with a special shout out to our returning snowbirds, most of whom beat the hummingbirds and orioles back north. All the seasons are special, but with its extra dosage of daylight hours and the vibrant colors and sounds of returning birds, blooms and butterflies, all of creation seems to speak out in loud and glorious voices of nature during the summer months. In the same way, we are propelled in a time of transformation following the Easter Season in Pentecost. If you recall from scripture, Pentecost Sunday is what launches the original disciples of Jesus into uncharted territory for them, through Christ’s death and resurrection, they are transformed from Christ’s followers to becoming the first leaders of the Christian church. A bold, bright and beautiful movement that grew in dramatic ways, just like the buds and blooms explode into their element during the summer months.

Likewise, the disciples of the early church, and we as church together in the present day have distinctly unique gifts to offer, creating a beautiful bouquet of loving service that the entire world can enjoy and be enriched from. Through Christ, we are called to integrate together to create community that hopefully makes life more beautiful and richer for everyone.

Monty and I continue to pray for all of you, for enjoying God’s abundance in all its forms in this season, seeing the transformation in nature that mimics our transformation through Christ. May you bloom and grow in your faith and in community together as part of the beautiful bouquet of the Kingdom of God.

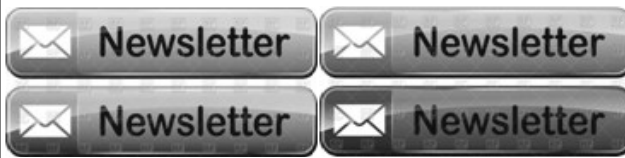

The meeting was called to order by President Sonia Heibel.

Secretary's report was reviewed and approved. M/S/C

Pastor's report was reviewed.

Old Business:

\*Purchasing a headset microphone for Pastor Julie was discussed. Sonia will order it and hook it up. Funds will come out of the Memorial account. M/S/C

New Business:

\*The propane contract was discussed. It was decided to contract 1400 gallons @ \$1.80 per gallon, with a monthly payment of \$200-as we have done in the past. M/S/C

\*Community Worship will be July 19th @ 10:30 in the Ashby Park with Presbyterian Church hosting this year.

\*VBS will be July 20-22nd with a program and community meal on the last day. Grue will supply snacks.

\*Parish Picnic: There was discussion on organizing a Parish Pontoon/Lakeside service on Pelican Lake this year. This would be the Parish Event and be held on Aug 16th. In case the weather doesn't cooperate, each church would have their individual regular services, and the Lakeside service would be rescheduled for Aug 23rd. More details to come!

\*Pastor Julie has been in discussion with Eagle Lake Church Pastor Ben, regarding having a Pet Blessing Day at Faith Haven on Oct 3rd. More details to come on this event.

\*World Hunger Grant: after discussion we agreed Pastor Julie will check into applying for it. This could be worked into the Backpack program at Ashby school. The Lions club and the Food shelf are also interested in participating.

Next meeting is June 7th following morning service.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

On Wednesday, May 13, 2026 I met with Grue Council, and we went through the Parish items as I thought in the interest of time we could then have Peace review and take care of these items.

\* Peace Council reviewed and agreed with Grue actions.

**NEW BUSINESS – GRUE ACTION in BOLD:**

- Parish Picnic-usually 3rd Sunday in August (16th), location, which church hosting?  
**In discussing the bullet item regarding a pontoon/lakeside service on Pelican in August, Grue Council proposes Pastor Julie move forward with this service as the annual picnic service. Pontoon/Lakeside service would be scheduled for August 16 – if it would need to be postponed due to weather, August 16 would then be regular worship at both churches at the normal time and joint service would be scheduled for August 23 (again, weather permitting).**
- VBS - Dates: July 20, 21, 22. (program with community meal)  
**Due to Grue having at most, one child participating, they offered to provide snacks/bars but not a meal. Pastor Julie has advised Kelli Weinandt of Grue's decision. Pastor Julie also advised Kelli that she would apply for a Thrivent Card to be used for VBS supplies/food on behalf of Peace and Grue.**
- Community worship date & location-July 19 in the park-Presbyterian hosting?  
**Pastor Julie confirmed with Jaime Sorenson that this year would be First's turn to host.**
- Pastor Julie in discussion with Pastor Ben @ Eagle Lake regarding having a Pet Blessing Event at Faith Haven on October 3 as well as exploring the possibility of a lakeside/pontoon service on August 23 on Pelican.  
**Grue supports moving forward with the Pet Blessing in partnership with Eagle Lake Lutheran. See first bullet point regarding proposed August 23 service.**
- Pastor Julie is also seeing if there is interest in attending an early, mid-week Twins game in August or September, requesting parish support as to whether I should continue to pursue this.  
**Upon discussion, Pastor Julie & Grue Council feel we have enough going on for the summer so Pastor Julie has withdrawn this item for consideration.**
- ELCA Hunger Grant  
There is an annual Hunger Grant open for application (must be submitted by July 1). Grant is a three year grant with an award amount up to \$10,000 per year. I contacted Candy Catoe who does the Backpack program at Ashby School working with the Food Shelf. Candy advised that both the Food Shelf and Lion's would like to participate in this ministry with us. (We can ask other organizations as well if anyone has suggestions.)  
**Grue supports moving forward with the grant application.**

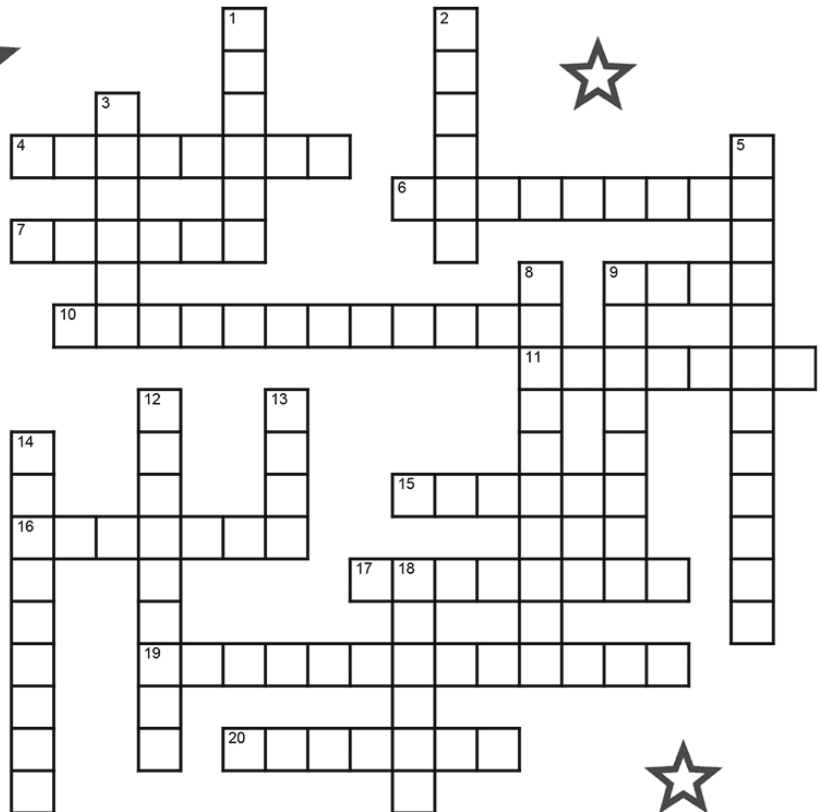
