A Word from Pastor Julie:
Growing in Love and Service Together

August 2026

"Many of us would probably be better fishermen if we did not spend so much time watching and waiting for the world to become perfect." Norman MacLean, "A River Runs Through It and Other Stories"

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace and Grue Parish,

Blessings to you as we continue our journey together as brothers and sisters in Christ. Just like every other year, summer seems to be whizzing by. Monty and I recently got back from our annual 4th of July fishing trip with our friends to NW Ontario and will be venturing even further north for lake trout fishing next week in Canada's Northwest Territories near the Arctic Circle. By now I suspect you may have picked up on the fact that Monty and I like to fish, and also share an adventurous spirit. Our annual trip to Sydney Lake was great as always, Monty brought me up there for the first time 23 years ago when we first started dating, and I was hooked (pun intended). I find fishing, and being at Sydney a spiritual experience, it's the only lodge on the lake, abuts Woodland Caribou Provincial Park so it is not unusual to go out fishing all day without encountering another boat. Aside from enjoying the beautiful sights and sounds of nature, fishing reminds me of the ever changing, dynamic, and the, yes, imperfect world we and all creation co-exist in. The quote from Norman MacLean really resonates me, because while I'm fishing, I accept the fact that there is no perfect formula for fishing, fish aren't always at the same spots (newsflash: fish swim), sometimes they're aggressive, other times, not so much. Sometimes they can't resist a chartreuse jig, other times, they're only going to be enticed by a pink one, same with tails, Rapalas, spinners, etc. Before we left, a friend had given Monty some rubber tails leftover from his family's recent fishing trip. Amongst the pack were some beautiful blue and white tails sparkling with glitter that Monty was informed just didn't work during their Canadian fishing trip a few weeks before. I enjoy a challenge so had to give them a try and caught walleye like crazy on those things. Again, a reminder that there is no perfect formula in fishing, or in life, the one constant is that change is indeed, inevitable. Church is no different, there is no magic formula, lure or attractant that speaks to everyone perpetually. The world changes, and while the fundamental things such as proclaiming the Gospel never change, our presentation requires some flexibility and adaptation in the same way you can't always use a certain color jig for all seasons, weather and lake conditions and expect constant and continued success.

I think we sometimes get hung up on this silly notion of "magic formulas" when it comes to church. We are always seeking ways to attract people to come to church, getting caught up in the "if only we had this" mindset. Often when we do this, in our quest for what we think will make things perfect, we miss out on the joy of simply just being church together in our current place and time. That's not to say that we shouldn't do some exploring of new fishing spots, or try a different bait, but we also need to embrace the mystery. Last week Monty had what we are convinced was a huge fish, aggressive bite, heft on the line, hung out deep, all the characteristics of a trophy. He played it patiently just like you should, and was just getting it up to the surface where we could see it, and then bring it in, when the line broke. He could have gotten really upset, but chose to just revel in the joy of how fun it was to bring it in, despite never catching a glimpse of it and simply enjoyed the mystery of how big "the one that got away" was. While catching the big ones are fun, they're not the ones we keep to eat, not the ones that feed and nourish us. I think sometimes those of us in smaller congregations lose sight of the joy of the more intimate human connection we find in rural congregations when we compare ourselves to larger congregations. Do we want to expand those connections by providing an inviting space to other folks to join us? Absolutely, but we also have to recognize that we may need to explore a bit to identify some hot spots, to dig in our tackle boxes to try something different, but not deviating from the fundamental truth that we are saved only by the grace of God made possible through Christ's death and taking on all the sins of the world, including our own. As we lean into our call to become fishers of people, how might we find different ways to minister, love and serve our neighbors? That's what matters in our ministry, loving service and meeting others where they are, just as Christ meets us where we are, not how many people are in the pews. After all, in my humble opinion, a panfish is just as tasty as a walleye or a northern (if not more!). The same holds true with church, our smaller congregations aren't any less appealing than a mega church.

Monty and I continue to pray for all of you, hoping that you are enjoying the summer and embracing the mystery of your faith journey, as well as the mysteries of life and nature. We don't need to have all the answers or figure everything out, we can lean into the fact God has everything we need covered. Ponder with Thanksgiving the things God has put in your life as individuals, and as community, particularly those things that come about in unexpected ways.

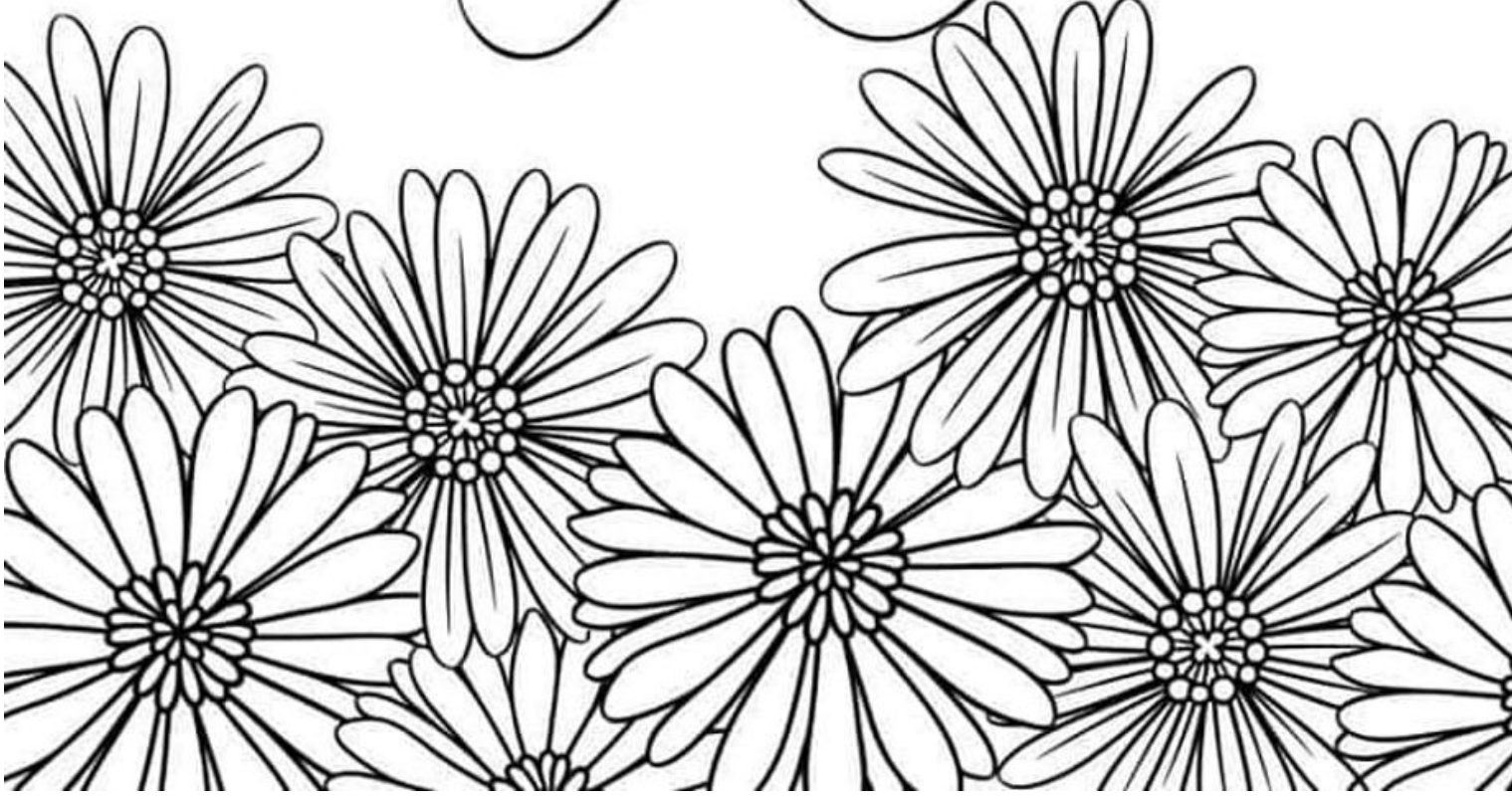
