Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace-Grue Parish,

Blessings to you and all you hold dear as we enter the excitement of fall. School has started, including fall sports and activities, fall hunting has begun, and for those of you partake in Pumpkin Spice season, enjoy! (Personally not my thing, but I must confess that I am beyond thrilled that DQ introduced a Maple Cookie shake.) In addition to the usual September chores and projects at Casa Carlson this year, we are replacing our driveway which is long overdue. I am so looking forward to a fresh new surface devoid of cracks, crevices and patched over potholes and the accompanying weeds that take root. Thinking about this project got me thinking about the transformation we receive through Christ's dying for the sake of all Creation that eradicates the ugliness of sin within ourselves, turning us into a new Creation in Christ. Martin Luther describes this as "the Happy Exchange", in which we exchange our sins for all of the beauty, love, holiness, righteousness and eternal life that belongs to Christ. Christ is ours and we are Christ's!

What an amazing affirmation of how deeply God loves us, that Christ takes on our sins so that we may be reconciled to God through Christ's death and Resurrection. Good news indeed!!! But in that exchange, God expects us to not simply bask in the glory of our newly sainted selves. There is so much work to be done in our hurting world and God has equipped us to work together as individuals, and as community to help in whatever way we can, be it time, talent or treasure. Jesus, the Living Word of God has the power to set us free and to empower us to work for the healing of creation and our neighbors.

On those days where you feel like the current state of my poor, beaten up, pothole filled driveway, be reminded of how out of an unimaginable love for you God sent Christ to die for you, and through that "happy exchange" your sins will be swapped out for the glorious promise of eternal life. Lean into the hope that whatever pothole of life you are driving through at the moment, your path to eternity has been paved in the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus.

“One of the most profound changes in my life happened when I got my head around the relationship between gratitude and joy. I always thought that joyful people were grateful people. I mean, why wouldn’t they be? They have all of that goodness to be grateful for. But after spending countless hours collecting stories about joy and gratitude, three powerful patterns emerged: Without exception, every person I interviewed who described living a joyful life or who described themselves as joyful, actively practiced gratitude and attributed their joyfulness to their gratitude practice. Both joy and gratitude were described as spiritual practices that were bound to a belief in human interconnectedness and a power greater than us. People were quick to point out the differences between happiness and joy as the difference between a human emotion that’s connected to circumstances and a spiritual way of engaging with the world that’s connected to practicing gratitude.”

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace-Grue Parish,

Blessings to you and all you hold dear as we start thinking about giving thanks (it is November after all!). If you’re like me, when I start thinking of things in my life to be thankful for, it seems like I’m running down a checklist: good health, an amazing husband, wonderful family and friends, enough food on the table, a roof over my head, the ability and opportunity to travel, etc. etc. National Holidays in November aside, we also talk a lot about thanksgiving in worship, there are Psalms of Thanksgiving, Thanksgiving for Baptism, hymns of Thanksgiving, and Prayers of Thanksgiving. These are lovely and beautiful things, but we should be careful not to confuse thanksgiving, with gratitude, which is a more substantial and robust sense of ongoing appreciation and awareness. Thanksgiving, by definition, is a response to a particular event, blessing or kindness we receive as opposed to gratitude, which is a deeper and more enduring feeling of appreciation of life and the blessings we receive. Now, don’t get me wrong, they are both very good and necessary things, but I think it’s important to make this distinction, as they are both vital practices in our lives as God’s faithful people.

I share this quote from Brené Brown as I personally had never thought about gratitude as a spiritual practice, but that makes complete sense. The interconnectedness she describes between gratitude, joy and community aligns so consistently to how God desires us to serve and love as one body within the parish and into the greater world. This sense of gratitude in being church together is so evident in Paul’s writings, which consistently include phrases like “I give thanks for you”. It’s a reminder to us that we should not only be thankful for what we receive, but grateful for the people God places in our lives to be community in the name of Christ. I can unabashedly state that I am very grateful that God has placed me in the community of Peace & Grue Parish.

As my own method of engaging in a spiritual practice of gratitude with intention, I am committing to post a daily reflection of gratitude on the church Facebook page every day in November. For those of you who aren’t on Facebook and would like me to email or text these reflections, please let me know.

¹⁵ Since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God’s people, this is the reason that ¹⁶ I don’t stop giving thanks to God for you when I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷ I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation that makes God known to you. ¹⁸ I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God’s call, what is the richness of God’s glorious inheritance among believers, ¹⁹ and what is the overwhelming greatness of God’s power that is working among us believers. This power is conferred by the energy of God’s powerful strength. ²⁰ God’s power was at work in Christ when God raised him from the dead and sat him at God’s right side in the heavens, ²¹ far above every ruler and authority and power and angelic power, any power that might be named not only now but in the future. ²² God put everything under Christ’s feet and made him head of everything in the church, ²³ which is his body. His body, the church, is the fullness of Christ, who fills everything in every way.

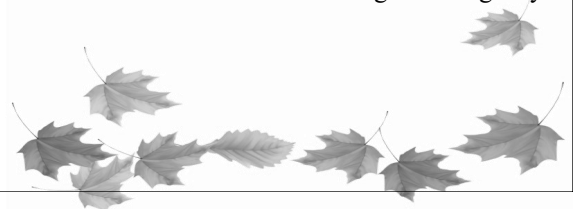

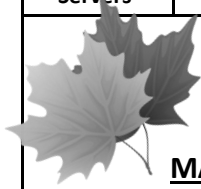
