A Word from Pastor Julie:
Growing in Love and Service Together

December 2025

“At this Christmas when Christ comes, will He find a warm heart? Mark the season of Advent by loving and serving the others with God's own love and concern.” Mother Teresa

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ of Peace and Grue Parish,

Blessings to you and your families as we enter into the season of Advent, and this busy time of the Christmas Season. As the song says, “It’s the most wonderful time of the year.” Personally, I am not so sure about that. I can find this time of the year to be stressful, overwhelming, at times depressing, and I know that I’m not alone. The holidays are tough for many people for a variety of reasons, particularly for those dealing with grief and loss. My prayer for all of you is to be gentle with yourselves and don’t forget to practice self-care. As much as I’d like to tell you that I have the ability to step back and immerse myself in the act of peacefully enjoying this Advent season of preparation and anticipation, more commonly I’m experiencing frantic last-minute scrambling and anxiety. While I love the Christmas season, I know I have to intentionally focus on the important thing, our celebration of the arrival of the Christ Child, who arrives with one purpose: to die on the cross to destroy all of our sin. I know that stressing out is *not* what God wants for me, or for any of us, so one of the things I focus on during the holidays is stress prevention. I stumbled upon an article from Laurel Kelly through the Mayo Clinic several years ago at the height of Covid (I would love to include the link but it seems to have ended up in the Land of Broken Internet Links, not far from the Land of Misfit Toys for all you Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer fans). Fortunately, I had cut and pasted this article while it was available back when it was published in 2019. I go back to it every year, and little did I know how much comfort I would get from it in December 2020 when my Dad died on December 30th, followed by my Mom on January 7. I hope you find it helpful as well, and I’ve also added some corresponding **Bible Verses** which reinforce the truth that God wants us to be healthy in mind, body and spirit.:

Tips to prevent holiday stress and depression

When stress is at its peak, it's hard to stop and regroup. Try to prevent stress and depression in the first place, especially if the holidays have taken an emotional toll on you in the past.

1. **Acknowledge your feelings.** If someone close to you has recently died or you can't be with loved ones, realize that it's normal to feel sadness and grief. It's OK to take time to cry or express your feelings. You can't force yourself to be happy just because it's the holiday season. ***Luke 18:7 And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them?***

2. **Reach out.** If you feel lonely or isolated, seek out community, religious or other social events. They can offer support and companionship. Volunteering your time to help others also is a good way to lift your spirits and broaden your friendships. ***Hebrews 10:24-25 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.***

3. **Be realistic.** The holidays don't have to be perfect or just like last year. As families change and grow, traditions and rituals often change as well. Choose a few to hold on to, and be open to creating new ones. For example, if your adult children can't come to your house, find new ways to celebrate together, such as sharing pictures, emails or videos. ***Isaiah 48:6 You have heard; now see all this; and will you not declare it? From this time forward I make you hear new things, hidden things that you have not known.***

4. **Set aside differences.** Try to accept family members and friends as they are, even if they don't live up to all of your expectations. Set aside grievances until a more appropriate time for discussion. And be understanding if others get upset or distressed when something goes awry. Chances are they're feeling the effects of holiday stress and depression, too. ***Ephesians 2:16 and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it.***

5. **Stick to a budget.** Before you go gift and food shopping, decide how much money you can afford to spend. Then stick to your budget. Don't try to buy happiness with an avalanche of gifts. *1 Peter 4:10 Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received.*
6. **Plan ahead.** Set aside specific days for shopping, baking, visiting friends and other activities. Plan your menus and then make your shopping list. That'll help prevent last-minute scrambling to buy forgotten ingredients. And make sure to line up help for party prep and cleanup. *Proverbs 16:3 Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.*
7. **Learn to say no.** Saying yes when you should say no can leave you feeling resentful and overwhelmed. Friends and colleagues will understand if you can't participate in every project or activity. If it's not possible to say no when your boss asks you to work overtime, try to remove something else from your agenda to make up for the lost time. *Acts 18:20 When they asked him (Paul) to stay longer, he declined;*
8. **Don't abandon healthy habits.** Don't let the holidays become a free-for-all. Overindulgence only adds to your stress and guilt. *Proverbs 25:16 When you're given a box of candy, don't gulp it all down; eat too much chocolate and you'll make yourself sick; (The Message translation)*
9. **Take a breather.** Make some time for yourself. Spending just 15 minutes alone, without distractions, may refresh you enough to handle everything you need to do. Find something that reduces stress by clearing your mind, slowing your breathing and restoring inner calm. *Psalms 23:3 he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.*
10. **Seek professional help if you need it.** Despite your best efforts, you may find yourself feeling persistently sad or anxious, plagued by physical complaints, unable to sleep, irritable and hopeless, and unable to face routine chores. If these feelings last for a while, talk to your doctor or a mental health professional. *1 Corinthians 12:28 And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues.*

Take control of the holidays

Don't let the holidays become something you dread. Instead, take steps to prevent the stress and depression that can descend during the holidays. Learn to recognize your holiday triggers, such as financial pressures or personal demands, so you can combat them before they lead to a meltdown. With a little planning and some positive thinking, you can find peace and joy during the holidays. *Romans 15:13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.*

Monty and I wish you all a season of joy and peace and every other good thing we receive through the gift of Grace from God in the birth, death and resurrection of Christ, made known by the power of the Spirit. Wishing you a blessed Christmas Season!

Hope to see you at the Free Harvest Meal on Saturday Nov. 22, 2025, turkey with all the trimmings and dessert (enjoy).

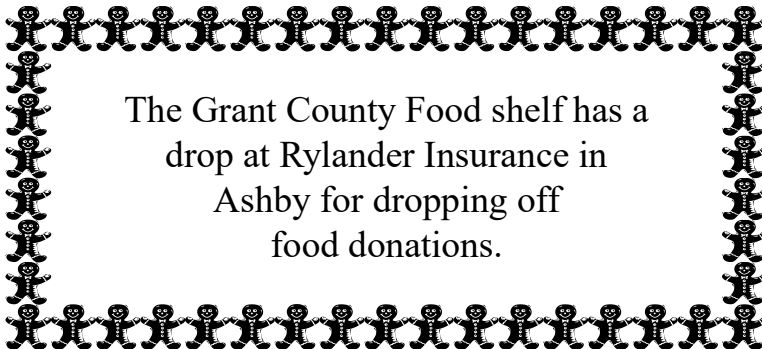
Our gardens did well this year and we would like to share it with all of you. The Lord blessed us with a great harvest.

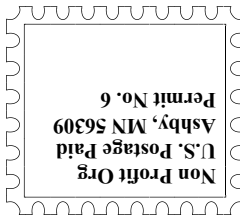
